Improving Our Communities

Street Nursing Program

RNs provide basic medical services and information to the area's homeless population. This service will eventually include tele-health at the campsites and assistance to get into shelters.

Food Insecurity Program

A food insecurity screening process for all inpatients. If identified with food insecurity, a referral is submitted to the local Yuba-Sutter Food Bank where the volunteers gather a three-day supply of specific food for each patient.

Behavioural Health Collaborative

A way to care for the behavioral health patient waiting in the emergency department. Adventist Health and Rideout work collaboratively with the county and imbed county paid crisis counselors in the emergency department 24 hours a day.
